QNA...1-2-3 is a DURING reading strategy. This strategy will help you as you read your textbook or an informational book. These texts have dark bold headings or titles each time they start a new section or topic. You will be using these headings to help you understand what you are reading.

QNA...1-2-3 (Question-Notes-Answer..1-2-3) **Q is for Question***

Every time you read a bold (dark) heading, think about what you know about that topic. Now turn the heading into a question. Write the question on paper. (See the back.)

N is for Notes

Read the section under that heading. Think about which details will answer or help answer the question you wrote. Write down the details as your notes. The 1-2-3... tells you about how many notes you should write for each question. If it is a short section, you may find only 1 or 2 details or notes to write. You may need to write 3 or more notes for a longer section.

A is for Answer

Now answer the question using the notes you wrote.
